D. Distinguish between.

1. Parallels of latitudes and Meridians of longitudes

A set of circles is drawn on the surface of the globe these circles run from East to West. They are called parallels of latitudes.

The imaginary lines which run from the North Pole to the South Pole are called meridians of longitude.

2. North Pole and South Pole

The axis of the globe on which it rotates, has two end points. These points are called poles. These poles can be used as two fixed points. The point at the top is called the North Pole and the point at the bottom is called the South Pole.

3. Eastern and Western Hemisphere

The prime meridian is the line drawn north to south at 0° (0 degrees) longitude. Sentences: The prime meridian divides Earth into the Eastern Hemisphere and the Western Hemisphere.

4. Northern and Southern Hemisphere

The Northern Hemisphere refers to the half of the planet that is north of the equator, while the Southern Hemisphere is all of the planet south of the equator.
