
Uses of 'Is', 'Am' and 'Are'

- Is is used with he, she, it, this, that and other singular
- Am is always used with I.
- Are is used with they, we, these, those, you and other plural nouns.

Some examples:

- 1. This is a cow. (singular)
 These are cows. (plural)
- 2. Meena is a pretty girl. (singular)
 Meena and Teena are pretty girls. (plural)
